# GLAZING

- Window Panes - single panes, 2 over 2, 6 over 6, 6 over 9, stained glass ...
- Individual panes or bond-on bars (placed on a single pane of glass to give the aesthetics of smaller panes)
- Single glazing, double glazing, acoustic glass, E-coatings, safety glass, toughened glass, fire resistant glass




# HORN DETAILS

- Horn details - typically Irish sash windows differ from those in Britain in that we have horns on the upper and lower sashes, whereas in Britain they have horns on the upper sash only
- As a decorative feature, you can choose to have no horn, or any style that you choose - we can manufacture any design.



# MOULDINGS

- We can match any moulding details that are currently featuring in your windows or advise you on new ideas, with as much intricacy or simplicity as you desire.



# IRONMONGERY

# PAINT COLOURS

- The windows can be painted a different colour on the inside and the exterior to suit the design and decor of your home.
- Also the spacer bar can be white, black or silver.



# BAY WINDOWS

- Unless you are building a new property, the design will depend on what is already present at the site. Your choices will be in the timber, glazing, surround details and paint colours, ironmongery.



# BAY WINDOWS

- A bay window that features a central picture window and 2 side windows will most often be set at an angle of 22.5 degrees. They project out from your home to create extra space and can open as sliding sash or casement windows.




# BOW WINDOWS

- A bow window is a series of 5 or 7 windows that are curved to form an arch. The design starts with the radius of the curved section of the building being measured and divided into 5 or 7 sections – the uneven number of windows ensures that the central focal point of the window is open to the best view.



# WINDOW PARTS

- There are two sashes that slide up and down within a timber case. The sashes are usually hung on sash cord. This is usually a waxed cotton rope with a polyester core. The sashes are balanced by a weight hidden in the frame.
- The alternative is the spiral balance system




